# Virginia Forest Landowner e-Update

Good morning Forest e-Update Subscribers,

This past weekend I drove my daughter to southern Louisiana, where she will be starting her first job as a professional forester (the seed doesn't fall far from the tree, right?). About halfway through Alabama, I realized I had been driving through nothing but loblolly pine plantations for HOURS! Every age class you could imagine, thinned stands, unthinned stands, and recent clear cuts ready to be replanted. It reminded me of a conversation I had with my brother a few years back. My husband and I met him at our grandmother's house in SE Georgia. He had just driven up from central Florida, a drive I have made many times as well. He made the comment that we were running out of trees. I asked, "Phil, what were you driving past during your 4.5 hour drive here?". "Oh, trees" he replied. If you've ever driven that stretch of I-95, you know that's correct.

Here in Virginia, we grow more trees than we harvest. In 2014, there was an annual surplus of 8.4 million tons of pine and 14 million tons of hardwood. In 2016, the Virginia Department of Forestry reported tree planting on 44,991 acres, exceeding their goal of 44,500 acres. One program that helps landowner replant is the Reforestation of Timberlands Program. This cost-share program is funded by forest industry with matching funds from the Commonwealth of Virginia's General Fund. If you want to learn more about this program, visit:

The other thing I realized on my trip to the deep south is that I don't miss the unrelenting heat and humidity at all. Trying to put a positive spin on it, I cheerfully told my daughter "Only 6 more months of this heat!" I'm truly happy to live here, in the shallow south.
