Summer is here. Campus is quiet. Lightening bugs are flashing. My vegetable seeds are in the ground. It is hot and has only rained once in the past 10 days. In invasive species news, earlier this week VDACS established a quarantine for the <u>spotted lanternfly</u> in Winchester City and Frederick County Virginia. The population has expanded from 1 square mile in 2018 to 16 square miles in 2019.
