Good morning Forest Update Subscribers,

We just returned from 3 weeks in South American (Brazil & Paraguay). The people, the food, and the scenery were amazing. We swam in the South Atlantic, visited one of the 7 natural wonders of the world (the Harbor of Rio de Janeiro), saw fields of giant termite mounds, eucalyptus plantations, and so many fruit trees, including mango, cacao, coconut palm, and banana. We even watched several different bat species pollinating an open banana flower one evening.

And did you know our very own loblolly pine (*Pinus taeda*) is grown in Brazil? In fact, there are almost 2.5 million acres of loblolly pine planted in the southern part of the country. Loblolly pine grows very fast in Brazil due to a combination of improved genetics, intensive management practices, high rainfall, good soils, and an extended growing season. I didn't see these plantations on this trip, but hopefully will in the future.

I highly recommend South America as a vacation destination!
