Virginia Forest Facts

- Virginia is 62 percent forested (15.8 million acres)
- Non-industrial private landowners own 62 percent (10 million acres)
- Forest industry owns less than 1 percent (186,700 acres)
- Public owns 18 percent (2.8 million acres)
- Hardwood forests make up more than 79 percent of all Virginia timberland (12.6 million acres)
- Softwood forests make up 20 percent of all Virginia timberland (3 million acres).
- Growth rates are exceeding removal rates
- Plantations account for 12 percent of Virginia's timberland and 65 percent of all softwood acreage
- Forestry contributes \$17 billion annually to Virginia's economy
- Forests provide more than \$2.5 billion in recreational opportunities
- Forestry provides more than 103,000 jobs in Virginia
- Forests provide at least \$21.8 billion annually in ecological and social benefits (soil and water protection, air quality, wildlife habitat, carbon storage, aesthetics and crime reduction).
