- Boxed lunches with drinks will be provided (or you may bring your own).
- Participants should bring their own beverages and snacks for the rest of the day.
- If you feel ill, please cancel your reservation. Full refunds will be given to anyone who cancels prior to the day of the tour.
- If the COVID-19 situation changes, there may be additional requirements or the tours may be cancelled. Your safety and the safety of our speakers and organizers, are our primary concerns. We will communicate with all participants to keep you up to date.
