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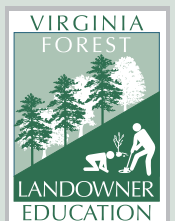

COURSE DETAILS

Where: Online, in the comfort of your own home.

When: Ten-week, self-paced course begins Monday, June 5, ends Friday, August 11, 2023.

Cost: \$55 per household

Computer Requirements: Participants will need a computer, web browser, Internet connection, and email address. Access to a printer is desirable. In addition, participants should download the most current versions of Adobe Acrobat Reader DC, RealPlayer™, and Google Earth Pro, all available for free online.

Materials:

All students will receive 5 books:

- Common Forest Trees of Virginia
- Native Shrubs and Woody Vines of Virginia
- American Forests: A History of Resiliency and Recovery
- Plant Invaders of Mid-Atlantic Natural Areas
- Welcome to the Woods: A Guide for New Virginia Woodland Owners

As well as access to an online Tree ID tutorial.

Only 1 set of print materials will be sent to each participating family; however, each family member may have their own account to access the online materials.

Everyone who completes the course will receive a copy of the award-winning book: *Legacy Planning: A Guide for Virginia Landowners*

No additional text or materials are needed to complete the basic requirements. Optional advanced assignments, which you are strongly encouraged to complete, require a dendrology field guide, camera, compass with adjustable declination setting, Google Earth Pro, and the Web Soil Survey. Information on how to obtain these resources is in the Announcements section of the course.
