Good morning Forest e-Update Subscribers,

You may recall in my last e-Update I started an English ivy control project. Here's what I can tell you – the Roundup PROMAX* application was a failure. Very little dieback. Instead of trying a different chemical, I'm trying a mechanical approach. First, I hand pulled all of the vines growing in the garden. Then I raked the soil and seeded it very densely with native wildflowers. My hope is that the wildflowers will seed in quickly and thickly and capture the site. It's been two weeks since the seeding and wildflower germination looks...well, I'm not sure. All sorts of little green things are germinating, but it's too soon to tell if they are desirable or not. I'll keep you posted. I realize the English ivy won't give up easily and I'll probably need to remove the vines all summer. But perhaps it will be manageable.

Another project we completed (by we, I mean my husband) was the planting of 300 shortleaf pine seedlings on a hillside. There are already quite a few mature shortleaf on the property and we planted 25 seedlings 4 years ago and they are thriving! Our goal is to create an open pine forest for diversity and wildlife habitat, while restoring a diminished species. You can learn more about shortleaf pine [here](#) and [here](#) and [here](#).
