So at this point, even I will admit that 30 tomato plants is too many! I am inundated and my freezer is full. I just hate to let any go to waste, because I know, in the dark cold days of February, I'll be longing for them. I suppose this is a good problem to have. It has been my best year ever for heirlooms – particularly Cherokee purples, the most beautiful of tomatoes.

A couple updates for you. First, in the August enewsletter, I mentioned the VDACS Beehive Distribution Program. Effective July 30th, this program was suspended due to an overwhelming number of applications. I'll update everyone if new funding becomes available for next year, or you can check here. I have not heard about the status of my application.

Second, you may have been hearing about an invasive species new to Virginia - giant hogweed. Here is an article from VCE's Weed Specialists on what to do if you suspect you've found this plant.
