Good Morning Forest Update Subscribers,

Many of us have a natural affinity for trees. We become emotionally attached to them. Back in the fall of 2017, I wrote an article about the fourth largest Norway maple in Virginia that was growing in my front yard and the difficult decision we made to cut it down. Since that time, the declining tree has been replaced with a white oak sapling.

With the Norway maple gone, we have a perfect view of another beautiful (albeit not native to Montgomery County) tree that now dominates the yard. A Shumard oak planted by the previous owner. Now, as far as nonnatives go, Shumard oak doesn't act invasive – in fact, it is native in other parts of Virginia. And let me tell you, ours is a showstopper. The 60-foot-tall tree has a conical crown, dense green foliage, and is a veritable rainbow of colors in the fall. An added feature is that it is far enough from our house, we don't worry about branches falling on our roof.
